Energize Your School Community</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Review www.itsasnap.org for ideas, statistics and participation details and discuss the ideas and national recognition awards with your students. Ask them to share their handwashing experiences and brainstorm ideas for classroom outreach projects (e.g., brochures, posters, advertisements, social media campaigns, websites, etc.) Discuss team teaching and cross-curricular opportunities with students, teachers and administrators and other school staff. 	<input type="checkbox"/> Date: _____

Develop an Action Plan</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Now, Have students select a curricular area and topic for their handwashing project and set up team responsibilities Have students brainstorm and create their projects. Guide students in outlining project steps and/or an action plan (e.g., tasks, timelines, etc.) <p>Tip: Have students explore ways to work with other classrooms and involve families.</p>	<input type="checkbox"/> Date: _____
<p>4. Set Program Objectives and Outcomes</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Have students define objectives and expected outcomes and plan how to measure them. 	<input type="checkbox"/> Date: _____
<p>5. Determine Necessary Resources</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ask students to investigate required resources, including time, people and materials. <p>Tip: Be creative! Approach your local cooperative extension or other organization for free resources or help.</p>	<input type="checkbox"/> Date: _____
<p>6. Have Fun Implementing Your Project</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Allow class time or give extracurricular credit for projects. Review project at each step; have students measure progress of their objectives. <p>Tip: After the project is complete, have students present it to another class.</p>	<input type="checkbox"/> Date: _____
<p>7. Submit Project for National Recognition</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Write your one page summary and email it to SNAP@cleaninginstitute.org. Deadline is January 31st! 	<input type="checkbox"/> Date: _____
